
The National Office was also partially closed following the furloughing of many staff. Staff are now slowly coming back, taking advantage of the new flexibility within the furlough scheme.

20 YEAR OLD ARTICLES GIVEN NEW LIFE AS PODCASTS



In the summer of 2001, three members of NTCG Handsworth – David King, Altia Walters and Ulite

Malcolm, taught a three-week series of singles seminars, to a class of South Birmingham College theology students.

The seminars birthed a ministry called Positively Single Network, through which they led seminars and workshops locally for several years. Early into the ministry, a local gospel music label called Kingship, granted them a monthly column on their website, through which they published 36 articles over a 4-year period, touching the lives of singles near and far.


Written at the turn of the century, some articles were very candid and ground-breaking, at a time of a great dearth of serious ministry addressing involuntary singleness. Now, ahead of the twentieth anniversary of the ministry's birth, many of those articles are being converted into podcasts and re-published as 'classics' under SAM's Faith for a Mate Academy.

Re-publishing the articles as spoken word media, brings to life and to light how germane they still are and why

today's millennials would be wise to take them seriously.

Positively Single Network came to a natural end, when the team became involved in a group commissioned to look at relaunching NTCG SAM nationally, which took place in April 2006.

The first of these classic podcasts "Stop the Sublimation" was published this month and the entire project will be completed by next summer. www.theologyforsingles.com

LOCKDOWN: DON'T GIVE UP!!

increased the urgency of intercession for souls with a high emphasis on the call to prayer and networking, from international to local level.

Coronavirus induced worldwide lock-down since March has prompted many churches and technophobic individuals to become digitally connected to the global benefits of online meetings. Marion encouraged the West Midlands team to get on board Evangelist Sharon Miller's growing on-line Prayer Closet Ministry.

The first lockdown online Evangelism conference was zoomed on the 9th May with the theme 'Lockeddown' Don't Give up. Almost 100 individuals logged into this session from as far afield as Jamaica, USA and Africa to hear Evangelist Miller speak. At a subsequent session themed 'Transformation' listeners were reminded that one of the keys to transformation is self-isolation and lockdown is a conduit conveying change, during a temporary delay permanent stage.

On 12th June the West Midlands Evangelism zoom session included the faith based initiative presentation of the project 'Rebuilding Brooklyn' by Bishop Hugh Nelson the Senior Pastor of Flatbush Church of God USA. Marion-(Joy) shared some of the pre Covid activities of the team:-

 A follow up testimony from the Bulgaria Mission Trip reported that three young boys had given their hearts to the Lord. The West Midlands team had also sent a substantial amount of clothing for needy Bulgarian children in the care of Church of God Schools.

 A coachload of 70, plus others supported December's Worcester Cathedral praise-fest outreach where more than 1000 people packed into the cathedral. The praise and worship so impressed a

visiting cleric from Wales he invited the worship team to minister at a wedding in Wales.

Following on from the online sessions some of which attracted maximum logging in, **Evangelist** capacity Marion set up a Virtual platform for altar call, with plans to continue post-Covid because there is a realisation that the current pandemic has caused disturbance worldwide spiritual and the on-line platform provides a safe link where Holy Ghost filled praying individuals are committed to pray with and signpost souls to local churches for kingdom growth and discipleship wherever they are.
